Representatives from Texas law schools hosted various free programs for students at their respective schools including student outreach events, such as at UNT Dallas, whose representatives were on hand at the admitted students open house, and legal career-related panels, such as at South Texas College of Law Houston, which hosted a NASA speaker panel. Recently, the section shepherded one of the nation's first-ever legislative and campaign law legal specialization areas into existence.
